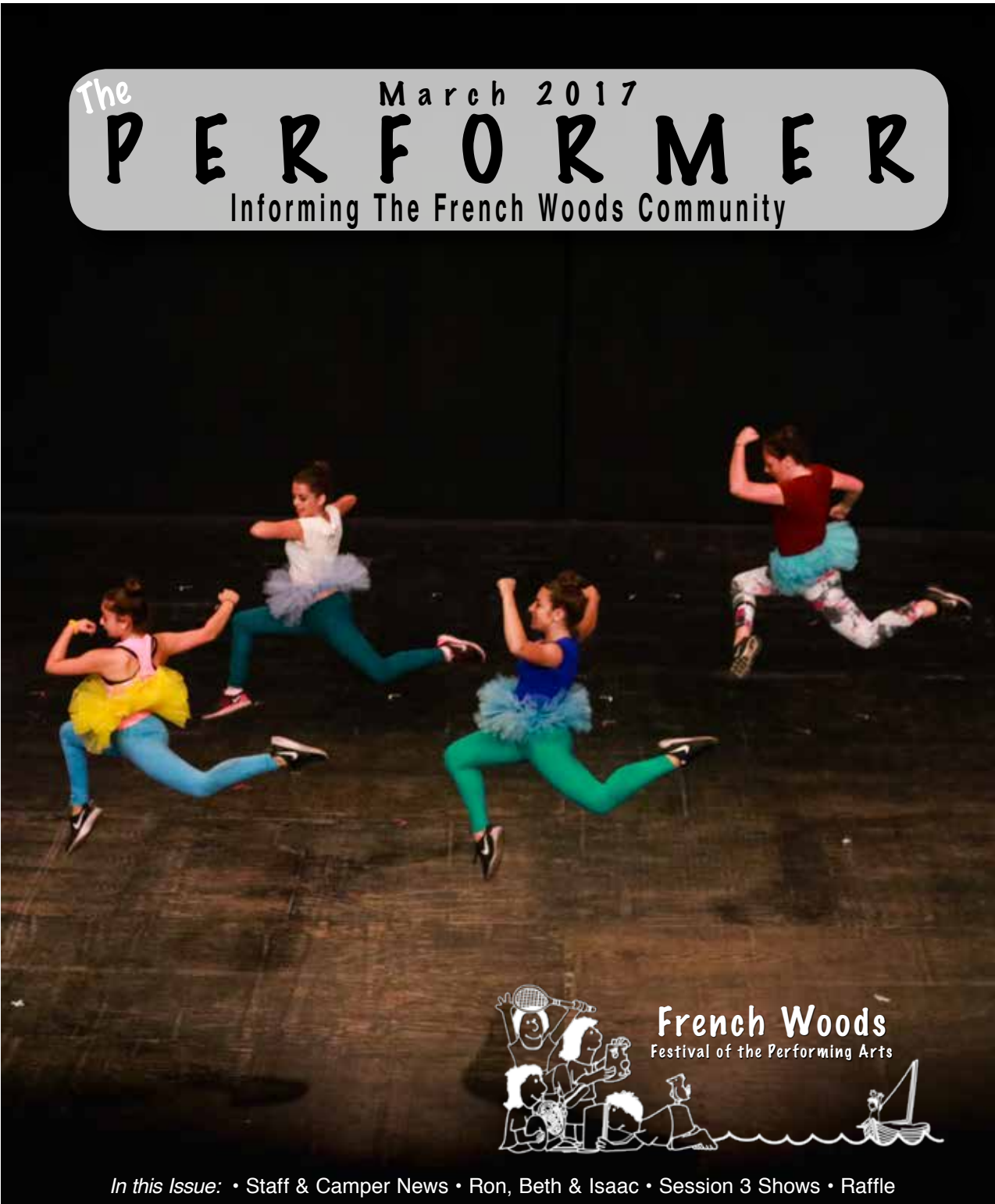

Our Most Frequently Asked Questions

1.) When do campers pick their activities? The three Major activities are chosen after Camp Director Isaac's orientation and with the help of your Head Counselor and Program Director.

2.) How many people in a bunk? Each cabin is home to up to eleven campers and three counselors.

3.) Do campers ever get turned away from an activity? No, our Program Director and staff spend the day working with each camper's schedule.

4.) How does laundry work? Your laundry is done weekly and is returned the same day. Make sure all your clothing is marked with your name!

5.) So, how's the food? The food is amazing! No kidding- an office poll puts steak, chicken wings/tenders,brisket (just like Grandma's), Ron's Philly cheese steak, taco day, sweet and sour chicken and ferro salad as our favorites. We have vegetarian options, gluten-free options, an extensive salad bar (including quinoa, lentils and sweet potato salad) and an alternative area everyday that includes hamburgers, hotdogs, veggie burgers and turkey burgers.

6.) What is ths cell phone and Wi-fi policy? Summer camp offers a great opportunity to learn about and navigate social situations while not being constantly connected to and immersed within a digital/virtual world. Having said that, there is a classroom available for sign-up during the day where our older campers can access Wi-Fi and approved sites for doing research for FW activities, school homework, SAT/ACT study.

Third Session Shows 2017!**

Aladdin (7 - 9 year olds)

Music by Alan Menken; lyrics by Howard Ashman, Tim Rice and Chad Beguelin. The story follows the familiar tale of how a poor young man discovers a genie in a lamp and uses his wishes to marry the princess that he loves and to thwart the Sultan's evil Grand Vizier.

Happy Feet (7 - 9 year olds)

In the great nation of the Emperor penguins, you're nobody if you can't sing. That's a real problem for little Mumble, because not only can't he sing, but he dances — something no self-respecting penguin would do.

The Aristocats (9 - 11 year olds)

Madame's jealous butler Edgar catnaps Duchess and her Aristokittens and abandons them in the Parisian countryside. What's a cat to do? Luckily, Thomas O'Malley and his ragtag bunch of Alley Cats come to their rescue! This feline adventure is sure to get your audiences tapping their feet to its hep, jazzy beat.

How I Became a Pirate (9 - 11 year olds)

Imagine Jeremy Jacob's surprise when he's accosted on the beach by a motley crew of pirates. They need a digger to bury their treasure and Jeremy, clutching his little sand spade, is recruited. At first, the pirate life is all fun: swabbing decks, counting ducats and singing shanties. But when night falls, Jeremy gets no bed time story and no tucking in.

Pete's Dragon (9 - 11 year olds)

In New England in the early 20th century, Pete is a nine-year-old orphan escaping from his brutal adoptive parents, the Gogans, with his only friend, a cartoon dragon named Elliott. Pete and Elliott find shelter with Nora,

a lighthouse keeper, and her father, Lampie. but Elliott is sought for medicinal purposes by the corrupt Doctor Terminus.

The Lion King (9 - 11 year olds)

Music by Elton John and lyrics by Tim Rice, we celebrate "the circle of life" with Simba, Nala, Mufasa, Rafiki, Timon, Pumba and the rest of the gang in this well loved musical.

Cats (11 - 12 year olds)

Cats is a musical composed by Andrew Lloyd Webber based on Old Possum's Book of Practical Cats and other poems by T. S. Eliot. *Cats* is one of the most popular musicals of all time having been performed around the world in numerous productions.

Sugar (11 - 14 year olds)

Sugar is a musical with a book by Peter Stone, music by Jule Styne and lyrics by Bob Merrill. It is based on the film, *Some Like It Hot*. Joe and Jerry, two musicians down on their luck witness a gang rub-out. Joe and Jerry hear about jobs available for a saxophone and a bass player, with a band scheduled to leave at once for Florida. There is only one problem - the band is made up of women.

We Will Rock You (11 - 14 year olds)

Based on the songs of Queen with a book by Ben Elton. Elton fashioned this hilarious futurist comedy around more than 24 of Queen's biggest hit songs WE WILL ROCK YOU reflects the scale and spectacle that marked Queen's live performances and earned the band its pinnacle position in rock history.

Crazy For You (11 - 14 year olds)

When Bobby Child's mother forces him to foreclose on a theater he decides to put on a play to pay the mortgage. Though the mounting is unsuccessful, it may lay the foundation for career success and true love. It's a high energy comedy that includes mistaken identity, plot twists, and fabulous dance numbers. With Classic Gershwin tunes including *I Got Rhythm*, *Nice Work if You Can Get It*, *Embraceable You* and more.

Lucky Stiff* (11 - 14 year olds)

Tony Award winners Lynn Ahrens and Stephen Flaherty exploded on the musical theatre scene in 1988 with their first off-Broadway show, this zany, offbeat, and very funny murder mystery farce. The show, is a classic musical farce, complete with slamming doors, mistaken identities, six million bucks in diamonds, and a corpse in a wheelchair.

Blood Brothers* (11 - 17 year olds)

This is a haunting musical tragedy of our times. The tale of two twins parted at birth and how their lives intertwined as they grow up. This musical fulfills the prophecy that twins separated at birth will die on the day they discover their heritage.

Dirty Rotten Scoundrels*(11 - 17 year olds)

DRS centers on two con men living on the French Riviera. The first is the suave and sophisticated Lawrence Jameson, who makes his lavish living by talking rich ladies out of their money. The other, a small-time crook named Freddy Benson, more

humbly swindles women by enlisting their compassion with fabricated stories about his grandmother's failing health. After meeting on a train, they unsuccessfully attempt to work together only to find that this small French town isn't big enough for the two of them. A hilarious battle of cons ensues!

Bullets Over Broadway (11 - 17 year olds)

is a musical written by Woody Allen, about a young playwright whose first Broadway play is financed by a gangster. The score consists of jazz and popular standards of the years between World War I and about 1930 by various songwriters.

Sweet Charity (11 - 17 year olds)

Taxi dancer *Charity* continues to have *faith* in the human race despite apparently endless disappointments at its hands, and *hope* that she will finally meet the nice young man to romance her away from her sleazy life. Maybe, just maybe, handsome Oscar will be the one to do it.

Scapin* (play for 11 - 17 year olds)

The crafty Scapin, servant to the household of Geronte, jumps into the story as he first promises to help in the affairs of his neighbor's son, Octave, then to aid in those of his own charge, Leander (Geronte's son). Both young men have fallen in love with unlikely, and penniless, beauties, and both need money to help solve their dilemmas.

The Gazebo (play for 11 - 17 year olds)

A writer of TV whodunits and whyzits, always with an eye toward inventing the almost perfect crime, gets into a spot where he has to commit a real do-it-yourself murder.
