### Our Most Frequently Asked Questions

1.) When do campers pick their activities? The three Major activities are chosen after orientation and with the help of your Head Counselor and Program Director.

2.) How many people in a bunk? Each cabin is home to up to eleven campers and three counselors.

3.) Do campers ever get turned away from an activity? No, our Program Director and her staff spend the day working with each camper's schedule.

4.) How does laundry work? Your laundry is done weekly and is returned the same day. Make sure all your clothing is marked with your name!

5.) So, how's the food? The food is amazing! No kidding- an office poll puts steak, chicken wings/tenders, brisket, Ron's Philly cheese steak, taco day, sweet and sour chicken and ferro salad as our favorites. We have vegetarian options, gluten-free

options, an extensive salad bar and an alternative area everyday that includes hamburgers, hotdogs, veggie burgers and turkey burgers.

6.) What is the cell phone and Wi-fi policy? Cell phones will be permitted to be used at camp for the following purposes: Listening to music, photography, use in program areas (under staff supervision), internet research for our older campers (under staff supervision in our classroom). Any other usage will result in confiscation of the phone. Phones can be used when a child is traveling to or from camp and on camp outings. Campers under the age of 12 are discouraged from bringing phones to camp.

Summer camp offers a great opportunity to learn about and navigate social situations while not being constantly connected to and immersed within a digital/virtual world. Having said that, there is a classroom available for sign-up during the day where our older campers can access Wi-Fi and approved sites for doing research for FW activities, school homework, SAT/ACT study.

## 101 Dalmatians (7 - 9 year olds)

Join all the dogs of London, as they daringly rescue the puppies from Cruella and her bumbling henchmen. With a delightfully fun score, lovable characters, and one of the most deliciously evil villains in the Disney canon.

## Winnie The Pooh (7 - 9 year olds)

This singing, dancing, romancing musical takes place in Manhattan, 1922, with all the jazz-age razzmatazz you want in a big, bright, brand-new Broadway blockbuster. It's the story of a Midwestern girl who arrives in New York determined to take the town by storm. "Millie" is a delightful valentine to the long-standing spirit of New York City and the people who seek to discover themselves there.

## Something Rotten (11 - 17 year olds)

Set in the 1590s, brothers Nick and Nigel Bottom are desperate to write a hit play but are stuck in the shadow of that Renaissance rock star known as "The Bard." When a local soothsayer foretells that the future of theater involves singing, dancing and acting at the same time, Nick and Nigel set out to write the world's very first musical. But amidst the scandalous excitement of opening night, the Bottom Brothers realize that reaching the top means being true to thine own self, and all that jazz.

## Violet\* (11 - 17 year olds)

A musical with music by Jeanine Tesori and libretto by Brian Crawley based on the short story, "The Ugliest Pilgrim" by Doris Betts. It tells the story of a young disfigured woman who

## 1776\* (11 - 17 year olds)

A musical with music and lyrics by Sherman Edwards and a book by Peter Stone. The story is based on the events surrounding the signing of the Declaration of Independence. It dramatizes the efforts of John Adams to persuade his colleagues to vote for American independence and to sign the document.

## The Curious Incident of the Dog in the Nighttime\* (play for 11 - 17 year olds)

It is 7 minutes after midnight, and Christopher stands beside his neighbor's dead dog, Wellington, who has been speared with a garden fork. Finding himself under suspicion, Christopher is determined to solve the mystery of who murdered Wellington, his detective work, forbidden by his father, takes him on a thrilling journey that upturns his world.
