## Send 'em Packing!

For some, packing for camp becomes an obsession. For others, it's a month long occupation. Still others simply fling open the duffel bag, toss in whatever is clean at the moment and are done with it. After many years of summer camp packing experience, we can tell you there are definite tricks to the trade.

Begin with two camp duffel bags. If summer camp looks to be an annual affair make sure they are made of a strong, durable, heavy weight material. Although they might not look it, these two bags will accommodate a lot more than you think. A laundry bag is a good idea to keep your dirty clothes together before they are sent out to the laundry each week. You can also use the laundry bag to pack linens, pillow, etc.

Next choose your preferred bed covering. A sleeping bag is fine but most opt for sheets and blankets. "Cot" sheets can be found with some searching but regular twin size sheets will work too. Light weight, inexpensive comforters are great. They are durable, can be washed and serve as an additional cover on those cool nights. They are also perfect to yank off the bed and take along to the evening performance. Don't be surprised to see grass burns and sticker burrs all over it when your camper comes home. You'll need to send towels, too. We recommend three towels and two beach towels.

We have sent you a clothing list as part of the parents guide, you can also see it online at [www.frenchwoods.com/packing\\_guide.htm](http://www.frenchwoods.com/packing_guide.htm) Add or delete as you see fit. We also advise that your child's name be on everything you send. This will take forever, but it's sound advice, so get your Camp Stamp, Sterling Name Tapes or laundry marker ready.

You will need to send enough underwear for a clean pair for about ten days (but don't be shocked when you discover half of it doesn't come home). Send lots and lots of socks - all the ones with the holes that you haven't had time to darn that secretly you'd like to throw away. Your child will do that for you.

French Woods launders campers clothes weekly in our own laundry. This being the case, be advised: Don't send anything that you care about seeing again and do not send any article whose appearance you care about. Unusual things can happen with commercial laundries and we can't guarantee that delicate items will come back the same way they were sent.

Send anything that is on its last legs as long as it's comfortable. Don't try to "get one last wear" out of something because if it's tight and doesn't feel good, your child won't ever put it on. Campers tend to wear clothes over and over even when they are dirty just because they feel broken in. Oh, and pack at least two, preferably three swimsuits.

My boys sleep in T-shirts and boxers and my daughter prefers a nightshirt, so these are included and marked for nighttime wear. A couple of pairs of jeans are a good idea especially if your child is interested in horseback riding. You can also include a sweat suit for those cool mornings and evenings.

As far as the little things go, flashlights, cameras, sports equipment, frisbees, playing cards, books to read at rest hour and other games that don't require batteries are packed. If you children are taking dance classes you will need appropriate shoes for the classes which interest them. Horseback riders need shoes with a hard heel. For those interested in theater, one dress outfit often helps the costume immensely. While iPods and Playstation Portable's may be fun, be advised that these small items are easily misplaced and camp can not be held responsible when they are. Cell phones will not work at camp, so keep them home, too.

Whether you coordinate colors or just toss in that old stuff, packing for camp can be an exhausting procedure. Help does come if your children continue as campers. After so many years, my kids have the packing down and do most of it themselves. All the linens and spreads, many of the T-shirts (especially those that have the camp logos on them), and lots of the incidentals live permanently in the camp duffel and are ready when it's time to go again. So make your list, check it twice, then send'em packing!

## Beth Backstage

So are you ready to go yet? I thought that I would take this month's newsletter as an opportunity to and talk about the Theater department. I figured it would be a good idea to clarify the audition process at French Woods.

The first day after everyone's arrival each session we have what we call a six-minor day. During our six-minor day, we give everyone at camp the chance to try out for the theatrical and circus shows and go to a class placement for music and dance.

At breakfast that morning we'll announce a theater orientation where we will explain all the details of the theater department for that session. We'll go over how and where to audition. Be sure to audition for the musicals; so long as you audition for the musicals in your age group, you are guaranteed a part in a show! You may have more than one theater audition that you are eligible to go to on that day. Go to as many as you can, because that way you have the best chance for a better part since you're auditioning for so many different roles. In addition to the Musical Auditions, we have a separate audition for each session's dramas. For that audition, you don't prepare a thing. We'll give you a part of a script to read. You'll get a chance to go over it while waiting for your turn to audition & after you read for us that's it for the primary auditions. Pretty simple, huh?

While it's fine to bring a prepared audition song with sheet music for accompaniment up to camp, "Happy Birthday" is a good choice too. Just sing any song that you are comfortable with and remember, we've got to hear everyone, so don't worry if you only get to sing a little bit of your song. If we need to hear more, we have call back auditions later on in the day (but I'll talk more about that later)!

While your doing all of this theater auditioning, be sure that you head over to circus, dance & music too!

There's a quick circus placement to see what level you are in if you want to be in the circus show and music & dance placement where we determine what level of classes to put you in. Don't worry about preparing for those either - everyone who wants to be involved will be.

Now that you've done your initial audition, we have one more round of "call-backs" in the theater department. Sometimes the first audition isn't enough to really get to see what role you'd be suited for, so we call back a few kids for every show so that we can better determine what role they would best be suited for. Don't worry if you don't get called back! Not getting a call back doesn't mean you won't get a role. Sometimes we were sure the first time and your already set with a part on the cast list but check the call back lists just in case.

It's a long day, but it will be worth it. That night or the following morning we will put up the cast lists in time for you to sign up for rehearsal on your Major Activity sheet. If you have any questions, ask them when you get to camp! We're all here to help.

*Remember:* No pressure!  
Everybody can be involved!
